BELMONT — Mr. Armand J. Dauphin, 80, of 47 Perkins Road, and formerly of Elm Street, Laconia, died at his home on Tuesday, July 16, 2002.

Mr. Dauphin was born July 8, 1922 in Laconia, the son of Joseph and Marie Dauphin. Mr. Dauphin served in the U.S. Army Air Force during World War II in Africa and Italy. He was a longtime resident of Laconia and was the greenskeeper at the Laconia County Club for many years.

Survivors include a sister, Alice Little, of Laconia; a brother, Joseph Dauphin of Florida; several nephews and nieces; and his companion, Mary Tutt of Belmont.
