BELMONT - John Douglas Miller, 76, died Saturday, March 24, 2007, at his home.

Born Nov. 1, 1930, in Lynn, Mass., he was the only child of the Rev. Robert Arthur Miller (Episcopal), originally of South Shields, Durham County, England, and Ellen Carmen Bliss Hemmeon of Lockport, Nova Scotia, Canada.

He was raised in Campton, Bridgewater Hill, and Nova Scotia; prepared for college at the Holderness School; and received his bachelor's degree from the University of New Hampshire. He served in the Air Force during the Korean conflict. He lived in Peterborough and worked as an occupational therapist at Crotched Mountain Rehabilitation Center in Greenfield, before moving to Deering and working at Osram Sylvania in Hillsborough. He retired to Belmont, to be near his beloved White Mountains.

He is survived by his three sons, David of Bloomington, Minn., Michael of Melrose, Mass., and Bruce of Toms River, N.J.; and four grandchildren, Jason, Amanda, Jeffrey and Amy.
